



## Introduction to Hairdressing 2016-2017

### QQI Level 5 Award in Hairdressing

#### Course Duration

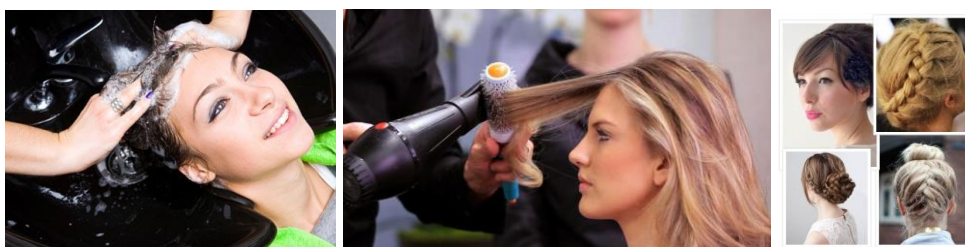
This is a one year, course running over 3 days from September to May.

#### Award

Successful completion of the Introduction to Hairdressing, will result in a QQI Level 5 Award in Hairdressing, 5M3351.

#### Entry Requirements

Leaving Certificate or Leaving Certificate Applied with exemptions granted to mature applicants. Entry is subject to interview



#### Course Content

**Communications** - Students will learn a variety of communication skills.

**Work Experience** – students are required to secure work experience one day per week in a salon. In addition in the work experience class students will be introduced to key themes within the world of work.

**Hairdressing Theory & Practice** - This module will introduce students to hairdressing as a career enabling students to become proficient in basic hairdressing skills and to equip them with the underpinning theoretical knowledge.

**Hairdressing Science** - This subject will equip students with an understanding of the scientific principles underlying hairdressing.

**Customer Service** – this key subject will provide students with the knowledge and skills to work as a front line representative in any organisation and is especially relevant to working in a salon.

**Safety & Health at Work** – this will provide the learner with the skills and knowledge to promote and maintain safety and health in the working environment

**Reception & Front Line Office Skills** – this will provide the opportunity to develop the essential reception and front line office skills need in any modern working environment



## Introduction to Hairdressing

### Progression

Students have the opportunity to progress to our Level 6 City & Guilds Diploma in Ladies Hairdressing.

### Access to Higher Education

A scoring system for QQI/FETAC awards applies for entry through CAO to higher education. The maximum point score possible is 400 if 8 distinctions are achieved.. Further information is available on the QQI website [www.qqi.ie](http://www.qqi.ie)

### Fees

Applicants are required to pay a €50 non-refundable registration fee on acceptance of an offer of a place.

At the start of the course students will be required to pay €500 if not a medical card holder this is made up of a €230 equipment cost which will include a student kit, hairdryer, textbook and uniform shirt. (these items will become your personal property); a € 50 hairdressing consumables contribution fee; a €20 student services charge and a €200 DES contribution charge. If you are a medical card holder the cost is €300 as medical card holders are exempt from the DES contribution charge.
