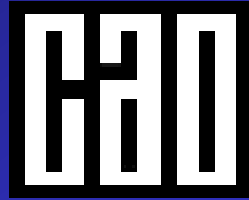

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‘REGISTRATION’

- Takes approx. 15 mins
- Personal details: Name, Address, DOB
- School Details: Roll number
- Buzzword: Available from Ms Ruane



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‘REGISTRATION’

- Course Choices: **Max 5** – course info available on search pages inc. Campus Code
- **Veterinary/Medicine/Pharmacy/Dentistry: Max 4 & another course**



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‘Application’

- Log in after registering
- Register course choices
- Write personal statement



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‘APPLICATION’

- Find suitable person to write reference (number of options)
- Submit his/her email address
- UCAS contact them to write reference



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‘Application’

- Student will be notified when reference is uploaded
- Payment (CREDIT/DEBIT CARD)
- YOU CANNOT PAY UNTIL ALL SECTIONS ARE COMPLETED

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‘Purpose of the CAO’

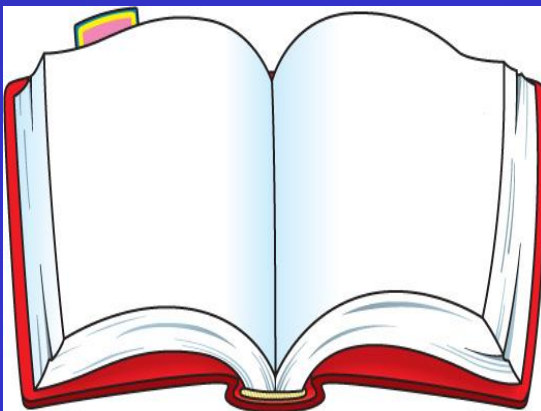
- Process all applications to undergraduate courses in Higher Education Institutions
- Keep record of offers/acceptances



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'The Application Process'

- Every student receives a CAO handbook





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‘Making an Application’

- Students are encouraged to apply online
- Website: www.cao.ie
- Online is cheaper & safer



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‘Two Applications on One Form’

- Two course choice lists
- Applicants may make up to **10** course choices on each list
- **10 on Level 8 (Hons. Degree)**
- **10 on Level 6/7 (Higher Cert/Ord. Degree)**



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- A student's choices on level 8 does not affect their choice on Level 6/7
- They are considered two separate applications on one form



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- Level 8- Higher Educational Institutes of Ireland-Universities-
Honours Degree
- Level 6/7- Institutes of Technology-IT's **Higher Certificates/Ordinary Degree**



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- Students may receive an offer on both lists (level 8 & level 6/7)
- They must then decide which offer to accept
- Or they may decide not to accept either offer



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‘Order of Preference’

- Students must place their choices in genuine order of preference
- Place the course you want the most first-then continue on down to number 10



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‘Your Application Number’

- If students apply online their ‘**application number**’ will appear on their receipt of Online Application’
- This number is private and should be used in every correspondence with the CAO
- **KEEP IT SAFE**



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‘Statement of Course Choices’

It includes:

- notification of your CAO application number
- Statement of Course Choice lists-
record of all courses students have
applied for



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Check the following carefully:

- Courses are in correct order
- Codes are correct
- Exam number is correct

If students have not received a statement
by the 1st June contact CAO
immediately



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- Included with the Statement of Application Record will be a **change of mind** form
- This is used to change the order of courses or introduce new courses
- **It is safer to use the Change of Mind Facility on the website**



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The Offer Process'

- A student's offer notice may contain an:
 - offer for a Level 8 course
 - offer for a Level 6/7 course
 - or both
- Students can only accept one offer
- **Be sure to do so within time limit**



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‘How places are allocated’

- The Higher Education Institutions tell the CAO how many places are to be offered on each course
- CAO then make offers to students with the highest points who have placed a specific course as their **first preference.**

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- Should some students decline to accept their offers these places become available to the next round of offers. **ROUND TWO**
- This process continues until all places are filled.



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‘Access Route’

HEAR-Higher Education Access Route

- Encourage school leavers from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds
- Offers on reduced points
- Extra college support available



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- HEAR is not a maintenance grant
- It is an admissions scheme
- Students must meet a range of **financial, social & cultural** indicators to be considered



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‘Benefits of HEAR’

- Reduced points
- Reserved number of places
- Must meet minimum course entry requirements
- Access to extra tuition/student advisers/advice regarding financial assistance etc



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‘Who is eligible’

- INCOME- Hear income limit-2017
- MEDICAL CARD- 31 DEC 2018
- SOCIAL WELFARE- 26 weeks in 2017
- SOCIO-ECONOMIC GROUP: non-manual, semi-skilled, unskilled manual & agricultural workers
- AREA PROFILE- high unemployment

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- You must meet indicator 1-**INCOME**
- Plus 2 other indicators

INCOME- calculated based on:

- Number of children in family
- How many are in full time education
- Parents income during 2017



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‘Timeline’

- **Consult HEAR handbook**
- **FEBRUARY 1ST- CAO application**
- **MARCH 1ST – Hear application online**
- **APRIL 1ST – submit all documentations to CAO-CAO number & PPS number on all documentation**



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- **APRIL – JUNE:** screening process
 - **LATE JUNE:** notification of outcome of hear application
- AUGUST:**
- Leaving cert results/CAO offers/successful hear applicants notified



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‘DARE- Disability Access Route to Education’

- Students who due to the impact of a disability may not meet the required points for their chosen course
- Students will already have been assessed



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- **Disabilities:** Asperger's Syndrome/Autism/ADHD/Specific Learning Difficulties(dyslexia)/Dyspraxia/Dysgraphia/Vision or Hearing impairment/ Mental Health Conditions/Speech & Language difficulties/physical disabilities etc



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‘Why apply’

- Reduced points
- Reserved number of places
- Must meet minimum course entry requirements
- On going support- tuition/student advisors etc



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‘Application online’

- **Section A:** Applicant information
- **Section B:** Second Level
Academic Reference
- **Section C:** Evidence of Disability



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‘Timeline’

- **Consult DARE handbook**
- **FEBRUARY 1ST** – CAO application
- **MARCH 1ST** – Dare application online-
complete Section A
- **APRIL 1ST** – submit **Section B**
(academic reference) & **Section C**
(evidence of disability)



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- **APRIL- JUNE:** screening of DARE applications
- **LATE JUNE:** Applicants notified of eligibility

AUGUST:

- Leaving Cert Results/ CAO offers to eligible DARE applicants



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‘HPAT’

- **Health Professions Test Ireland**
- Any student applying for Medicine in Ireland must complete the HPAT
- They can register from early November
- They must register **on-line** with **HPAT Ireland**



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- They need their **CAO number**
- **Closing date: 20th Jan 2019**
- **Cost: 130 euro**
- **Late Applications: 1st Feb 2019 (200)**
- **Test Date: 23rd February**

- Can take up to 2 months (be prepared)

- P21- (Employee) Tax Office- (3 weeks) or online www.revenue.ie
- Income from previous year (**2017**)
- Social Welfare Payment: up to date letter on benefits
- RP50- (Notification of Redundancy)



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- Notice of Assessment (Self Employed/farmer) Tax Office
- Social Welfare/Medical Card
- **DO NOT SEND ORIGINALS:** Birth Certs, P21, PR50, Notice of Assessment etc- **SEND GOOD QUALITY PHOTOCOPIES**
