First Day in St. Louis

 The first day commences with a welcome ceremony, which lasts about 20 minutes.



- Parents / guardians are invited to attend with their son / daughter.
- After the ceremony, light refreshments are served to the parents / guardians.
- The students will attend an assembly.





At the assembly, the students will be given the schedule for the day, and we will answer any questions they may have. The students will then be divided into the various class groups.

When they go to class, they will get a homework journal, and their teacher will explain how to use it.

They will receive their timetable, which will also be explained in detail.

- Later in the day the students will be assigned a locker and they will receive all the books they need for the year.
- The Prefects will help the students to sort out the books for all the different subjects and they will help them to organise them in their locker.
- We will be taking your child's photo at some stage during the first day, this will be used to identify him / her on the school administration system.
- The students will get a tour of the school and if time permits, they
 will get to take part in a treasure hunt.
- On the second day of school all students will have some regular classes, computer classes and some fun activities.

Unless they have an Irish exemption



BBBS



Our First year students get to take part in the Big Brother Big Sister programme, for one hour every Thursday morning.

School Lockers

- A locker is assigned to all students, after the school fees are paid in full.
- Students must purchase a lock for their locker, Diamond's Hardware, Kiltimagh supply locks suitable for our lockers.
- If a student loses their locker key, they may contact either Aiden or Brendan, who will cut the lock off the locker.
- It is important that students change their books at break and lunch time, to avoid their schoolbags being too heavy.

After School Homework Club



If your child had an educational assessment, they may qualify for a place in the Homework club after school.

Some of the kind ladies in the Homework Club will help your son or daughter to complete their homework and they will get free fruit and a drink.

The Homework Club starts at 4.15pm and finishes at 5.30pm Monday to Thursday.

It is supervised by our team of Special Needs Assistants.

If your Child feels Sick in school

- If your child feels sick and they really cannot stay in school, they tell
 their class teacher that they don't feel well, and they want to go home.
- They gather their belongings, go the school office and tell Rena or Imelda that they want to go home. They will ring a parent or guardian to collect them.
- The student's contact numbers are available on our school administration system.
- A student cannot leave the school without their parents or guardians signing them out, so you must come into the school office to collect your child.

CAT 4 Tests

All 1st year students will be sitting the CAT 4(cognitive attainment tests) during their first two weeks in St. Louis Community School.

These tests will help us to determine the students who may require additional support.

The results of the CAT 4 tests will be sent home with your son or daughter, after we have analysed the results.

Irish Exemptions

Students will only be permitted to join the Irish exempt class, after the official Irish exemption certificate has been processed.

Students who are not studying Irish will receive either literacy or numeracy support.

Junior Cycle Schools Programme



The Junior Certificate School Programme (JCSP) operates within the Junior Cycle curriculum.

It is an intervention into the Junior Cycle and not an alternative to it.

It helps to make the curriculum accessible and relevant to young people who would benefit from a different approach to the Junior Cycle.



The JCSP approach involves:

- analysing students' strengths and weaknesses and taking note of any specific recurring difficulties.
- •planning programmes of work which both build on students' abilities and address the main obstacles which hinder their progress.
- engaging in dialogue with young people and their parents regarding their needs and their progress in school.

Ms. Andrea Maloney and Mr. Sean Costello are the Junior Cycle Coordinators.

School Layout



- Our school is basically a square on four different levels, with a piece built onto it.
- Your child will have a room number on their timetable and within a few days they will have figured out exactly where there are going and how they are going to get there.
- If their class is on the second floor, then the room number on the timetable will say 2-113, the first number is always the floor level.

Homework Journals

- •Students are asked to have their School Journals with them for every class period to record their homework.
- Parents are asked to check that their son / daughter is completing their homework and to sign the Homework Journal.
- •The School Journal is to be used only for the recording of homework, and communication between parents/guardians and the school.

We ask students to keep their journals in good condition and free from graffiti.

Non-Uniform Days

 Occasionally, we organise non-uniform days in aid of local charities.

Students are permitted to wear their own casual clothes

on days like these.

Parents will be notified of such days.

School Bags

Schoolbags are extremely heavy in secondary school, if students don't use their lockers wisely.



All of our classes are one hour in duration, so the students have a maximum of six subjects in a day. When they come into school in the morning, they should go to your locker and put all of their books into it, except the books that are required for the first two classes.

At break time students should put the books from the first two classes into their locker and take out the books for the next two classes.

After they have eaten their lunch, they should put the books they had for

After they have eaten their lunch, they should put the books they had for classes 3 and 4 into their locker and take out the books they require for the last two classes.

Homework

- When the students are going home, they should bring home all the books for the subjects in which they have been assigned homework.
- They may not get homework in all of the subjects, as we try to ease them in gently with the homework.
- It is very important that the students record all of their homework in their homework journal.





Lost Property



All items of clothing and belongings should be clearly labelled.



If property is lost or mislaid, the student should contact Aiden or Brendan.

Changing Subjects

If your son or daughter wants to change their optional subjects, please take the following steps;

- The student must make an appointment with Ms. Flanagan, she will check the class sizes and see if there is a space available, then she will discuss the implications of the subject change.
- The student must bring in a note from their parents or guardians, granting permission to change subject and present it to Ms.
 Flanagan, who will make the change on VSware.
- She will also inform the relevant subject teachers and the Book Rental coordinator.

Mobile Phones

Must be turned off and out of sight at all times, otherwise they are confiscated until Friday after school.

The **St. Louis Community School App** is our primary means of communicating with parents, we don't send out any information by post. To download this app, please take the following steps;

- Go to the App store.
- Type St. Louis Community School into the search tab, our school crest will appear beside the school name.
- Click download, then click open.
- Read and accept the terms and conditions.
- Click I am a Parent / Guardian, then click Next.
- Enter the mobile phone number that is registered with the school.
- A one time code will be sent to you via text message.
- Enter the code, then enter your email address and create a password.
- Click register, Next and follow the instructions on the screen.

- The payment will appear here.
- Please ensure all payments are paid in full before school commences.

VSware is our school administration system.



- 1. Log onto stlouiscs.vsware.ie (Please ensure you use this exact address, Nowww. or http in front of stlouiscs.vsware.ie)
- 2. Then click create / reset password
- 3. Type in the username you received in a text message from the school
- 4. And the last four digits of the mobile phone number you have registered with the school
- 5. Create a new password for yourself.

School Uniform

Boys

- Grey uniform shirt.
- Wine uniform round neck jumper with crest.
- Dark grey uniform trousers.
- Black shoes or runners without coloured branding.

School Uniform

Girls

- Navy v neck jumper with crest
- Cream, cotton, uniform blouse worn with collar turned down.
- Knee-length, pleated, check uniform skirt or navy uniform trousers.
- Plain (not embellished), flat, completely black shoes.

Class Rules

In order to create a classroom environment which is conducive to learning and development, the following rules apply in the classroom:

The authority of the teacher in the classroom must be respected at all times.

Students must be on time for each class and have all materials required for class. Borrowing of books or other materials is prohibited.

Students must respect the right of their fellow students to work without hindrance or distraction. Disruptive or inappropriate behaviour is not permitted in the classroom.

An immediate apology is required for an offence caused to teacher or students in the classroom.

To answer a question or seek the attention of the teacher a student must raise a hand and wait for permission to speak.

Students must leave the classroom in an orderly manner when class is dismissed.

Written permission from a teacher, Year Head, Deputy Principal or Principal, is essential when a student is absent for a class or part of a class period.

The school uniform as stated in the School Journal must be worn at all times during the school day or when engaged in school activities.

A high standard of neatness and personal hygiene is expected of all students.

Mobile phones are not permitted in the school. If found they will be confiscated and returned to the parent/guardian of the student on Friday after school.

Interference of any kind with another person's property, including school property, is a serious breach of the school's code of Conduct. Students or their parents/guardians may be required by the school to pay for the repair or replacement of property damaged by students.

Items which are dangerous, inappropriate or a cause of distraction, are not permitted in the school and may be confiscated.

Chewing gum is strictly prohibited throughout the school and grounds of the school.

Eating or drinking in classrooms is prohibited

<u>Procedures for Parent Teacher Meetings</u>

- All Parent Teacher Meetings will take place in the new building, in the Louis Bautain hall and the classrooms upstairs.
- School will finish at the earlier time of 3.45pm on the afternoon of the Parent Teacher meetings. School buses will be notified of the early finishing time.
- The meetings will take place between 4.15pm and 6.45pm
- Please bring a biro and a list of your child's teachers with you.
- Please make every effort to attend your child's meeting.

Procedures for Students Arriving Late or Leaving Early

If a student arrives late in to school, they must be accompanied by their parent or guardian and sign in at reception.

This rule is to ensure our students are kept safe at all times.
